Part 1:

Use the Library of Congress website (<u>www.loc.gov</u>) to find one **visual, audio recording, map, or written primary source**. Copy and paste primary source onto a word document. Cut and paste a link to the site onto a word document.

Part 2:

Under pasted link, do a primary source analysis on your chosen primary source. This is a final demonstration of your ability to analyze primary sources. Include observations, reflections, and things that you wonder about. Make sure it is quality and complete.

Part 3:

Look for a digital secondary source that is in some way related to the primary source. Use the secondary source to learn about some aspect of the primary source. After reading through the information, clearly identify the secondary source, and provide a link to it on the Word Document (if it is digital). Then, in a paragraph describe what you learned about the primary source from the secondary source.
